
What We Do

- Work in partnership with teachers, schools, and districts to address the specific challenges of their student populations and geographical regions
- Build partnerships with other organizations (such as BOCES, Teacher Centers, museums, community organizations) to improve the quality of teaching and learning in schools

How We Benefit Students and Teachers in New York State:

Enhance student achievement

Research indicates that students whose teachers have participated in NWP programs show significant gains in writing performance, particularly in areas aligned with the Common Core Standards.

Help keep good teachers in the classroom

Research indicates that the NWP model of substantive, inquiry-based professional development sustains teachers at all stages of their career and reduces attrition of effective teachers.
